General Criteria

The general criteria apply across all the research areas/themes. Academicians, industry experts, economists, policy analysts, trade lawyers, or subject-matter experts with good academic and professional credentials; the ability to provide evidence-based feedback and recommendations; and, who can provide constructive criticism to the authors are all eligible to apply for the panel of peer review.

Study Themes

- Trade Gender, and Inclusivity
- Trade and Investment
- Trade, Environment and Sustainability
- Market Access and Tariff Barriers
- Trade, food security and supply chain resilience
- Government Procurement
- Trade Remedies

The peer reviewers are expected to possess expertise in key areas such as sustainability, environment regulations, government procurement, food security, supply chain resilience, sustainable food systems, trade remedies, investment law, and trade and gender considerations. A thorough understanding of relevant policies, economic frameworks, and international regulations is imperative. Their role is to assess the studies implications in climate, sustainability, procurement complexities, food security dynamics, and gender inclusivity.

In light of the outlined research themes, prospective peer reviewers are encouraged to submit their applications, including their CVs showcasing their relevant expertise and prior peer review
