About us

The Centre for Trade and Investment Law (CTIL) was established in the year 2016 by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, at the Indian Institute of Foreign Trade (IIFT). CTIL's primary objective is to provide sound and rigorous analysis of legal issues pertaining to international trade and investment law to the Government of India and other governmental agencies. The Centre has created a dedicated pool of legal experts who routinely provide technical inputs to various agencies of the Government of India and work towards enhancing India's participation in international trade and investment negotiations and dispute settlement.

CTIL has commissioned as well as is planning to commission studies in broad research areas of contemporary relevance. We have outlined criteria for peer reviewers for the corresponding research areas, as follows:

General Criteria

The general criteria apply across all the research areas/themes. Subject-matter experts (**non-legal**) with good academic and professional; the ability to provide evidence-based feedback, and recommendations; and who can provide constructive criticism to the authors are all eligible to apply for the panel of peer review.

- Trade and Investment
- Trade, Environment and Sustainability
- Market Access and Tariff Barriers
- Trade, food security and supply chain resilience
- Government Procurement
- Trade Remedies

The peer reviewers are expected to possess expertise in key areas such as sustainability provisions, environment regulations, government procurement, food security, supply chain resilience, sustainable food systems, trade remedies, investment law, and trade and gender considerations. **A thorough understanding of relevant trade policy data and regression models, economic frameworks, trade economics, statistical software such as Stata and languages R and Python, and international regulations is imperative. Their role is to assess the studies' economic implications in climate, sustainability, procurement complexities, food security dynamics, or gender inclusivity.**

In light of the outlined research themes, prospective peer reviewers are encouraged to submit their applications, including their CVs showcasing their relevant expertise and prior peer review experience. Interested experts should forward their CVs and pertinent details, along with a copy sent to ctiloffice@iift.edu for consideration before 31ST July 2024.
